My name is Brian Kanouse, and I am writing to give insight as to the character of Ryan Rooney. In what follows, I will address his sensitivity to moral problems, his willingness to stand up for his principles and for others, and the integrity he displays through the way he carries himself

Ryan has stayed after class on numerous occasions to discuss moral issues that have arisen in this life, usually for the first time. Those conversations have included his religious beliefs and concerns, how he should react to discriminative behavior from others, and how he can relate to himself in a more principled fashion. On each of these occasions, I have been extremely impressed with the earnestness in which the questions are asked, the compassionate nature of his concerns, and the clear self-reflection it displays. It doesn't come "naturally" to him, which is commonly said as a way of dismissing the work someone puts into something. He is intentional with his actions, which makes them as authentic as they are.

I genuinely like being around Ryan. He is a stellar person, in addition to being a solid student and an excellent athlete.
